

Assignment 4

For all questions, you should not need to cite any literature or prove auxiliary facts. They follow from facts given in the lectures or stuff you've learned in previous courses.

- Q1 Let (X, Σ) be a measurable space and ν be a σ -finite signed measure on Σ . Apply the Lebesgue-Radon-Nikodym theorem to show that there is a Σ -measurable function $h: X \rightarrow \mathbb{R}$ such that $|h(x)| = 1$ ν -almost everywhere and for all $A \in \Sigma$,

$$\nu(A) = \int_A h d|\nu|.$$

What can you say about the uniqueness of such a function h ?

- Q2 Suppose (X, Σ, μ) is a measure space with $\mu(X) < \infty$. For measurable functions $f, g: X \rightarrow \mathbb{C}$, define

$$d(f, g) = \int \frac{|f - g|}{1 + |f - g|} d\mu.$$

- (a) Show that d defines a metric on the set of equivalence classes of complex-valued, measurable functions on X , where two functions are considered equivalent if and only if they are equal almost everywhere.
- (b) Show that $[f_n] \rightarrow [f]$ with respect to this metric if and only if $f_n \rightarrow f$ in measure.

(This indeed is Question 42 from the problem sets.)

- Q3 Let $X = [0, 1] \subset \mathbb{R}$. Consider the measure spaces (X, \mathcal{L}, m) , where \mathcal{L} is the σ -algebra of all Lebesgue measurable subsets of X and m is Lebesgue measure, and $(X, \mathcal{P}([0, 1]), \mu)$, where μ is counting measure. Let $D = \{(x, x) \mid x \in X\} \subset X \times X$. Show that the following integrals are well-defined and evaluate them:

- (a) $\int \chi_D d(m \times \mu)$
(b) $\int \int \chi_D dm d\mu$
(c) $\int \int \chi_D d\mu dm$
